


Upgrade to Maahoe, Patatee and Hiinau

One of the major projects that have been on the Board's agenda in the past was to renovate the learning space around Rooms 9 (Maahoe), 8 (Hiinau) and 7 (Patatee). This project was put on hold as the MOE had told us that we were relocating to the Lakeside development in 2024- 2025. As you know this relocation has been put on hold so on the 24th of March contractors will be onsite to start a 6 week project to develop an exterior learning space between the classes of Ngaa Maramara o Ngaa Muka.

This project has been in the pipeline for the past 14 months and it is an indication that the MOE is happy to invest in developing our current site while we wait for an outcome on our relocation to Lakeside.

The image below is what the exterior learning space will look like. There will be a deck between all three classrooms and each classroom will have a sliding door that will ensure ease of access to the deck between the classrooms. A roof will also be installed to cover the deck between the classrooms guaranteeing that our children will have cover from the sun in the warmer months and a dry place to sit outside when it rains.



Staffing Update

In Week 5, I granted Louise Price (Room 6) medical leave. Louise will be back on staff when she is feeling better. While we wish Louise a speedy recovery, Anne Mitchell has taken on the responsibility of teaching the students of Room 6. 2025 Term Dates:

Here are the term dates for 2025:

Term 1 - 29 January to 11 April (with a Ministry-required teachers-only day on 7 February).

Term 2 - 28 April to 27 June (with a MOE-sanctioned Maths teacher-only day on the 28th of April)

Term 3 - 14 July to 19 September (TOD for Koroneihana on 5th September).

Term 4 - 6 October to 12 December.

In 2025, we have planned for two remaining Teacher Only Days. This could change due to having to fit in allocated MOE curriculum days. If there are going to be any additional Teacher Only Days added to the calendar, we will give you all ample notice of when this may happen.

Term 2 we have:

Term 3 we have:

 One TKP Teacher Only Day for Koroneihana - 5th of September

In 2025, schools are legally required to be open for 193 days. Every year the Board of Trustees works within the Ministry of Education's guidelines and decides when the school is open for instruction. Teacher-only days are not included in the 193 days as on teacher-only days the school is closed for instruction.
