Student-Led Conferences

On the 12th and 13th of May 2025, we will be running our Term 2 Student-Led Conferences and we hope as many of you as possible will be able to come along with your child and hear about their learning.

We put great value in the children sharing and talking about their learning with you and strongly encourage you to support your children during the student-led conferences.We look forward to seeing you at Student-Led Conferences!

Attendance -

I would like to thank you all for the improvement in our regular attendance in Term 1 this year.

In Term 1 2024, only 59% of our students were attending 9 days out of 10 per fortnight. This year we are sitting at 66% of our students being at school 9 times out of 10. This is an increase of 7% since Term 1 2024 and an increase of 54 students. This is awesome and I hope that we can keep this improvement in Term 2.

In Term 1 2024, we had 6% of our students attending 7 days or less in a fortnight. This is now at 7%. This is slightly more than Term 1 2024, but I am sure we can work on it together and reduce the number of children who are attending 7 days or less per fortnight.

Reporting to parents in 2025

In previous years we have sent hard copy reports to the caregivers of Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 students at the end of Terms 2 and 4, and of Years 0, 1 and 2 students on the 6 monthly anniversaries of their start date (ie. after 6, 12, 18 etc months at school).

This year, to keep our reporting consistent across the school, ALL children will receive a report in Terms 2 and 4. We made this decision based on our feedback in 2024 from our Board survey, where 83% of our parents who responded supported the idea to realign our Year 0 - 2 reports with the rest of the school. This will only affect those children who last received a report in Term 3 of 2024 and were subsequently due for their next report at the end of this term. These children, along with everyone else, will now receive their next report at the end of Term 2.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding this change, please pop in to see us!

In Term 2, we will also have parent meetings to explain the refreshed curriculum in English and Maths and what this means for your child's report in Term 2 and Term 4.

In 2025, schools are legally required to be open for 193 days. New Zealand Traveller Declaration

Going overseas for the school holidays? Everyone travelling into New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration, including returning New Zealand passport holders.

Its FREE and you can do it on the <u>online form</u> or on the <u>NZTD</u> <u>app.</u>

If you're travelling as a family or group and completing multiple declarations, the <u>NZTD app</u> allows you to copy your travel details into another declaration, making it easier to complete multiple declarations for the same journey. The submitted declarations are then all easy to see within the app.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration collects travel, customs, immigration and biosecurity information and aims to improve the safety and security of New Zealand. It replaces the paper card you used to fill out on the plane.

To make your arrival easier, do your digital declaration before your flight back to New Zealand.
