Term 1 Progress:

Update on our strategic aim of;

'Delivering accelerated learning outcomes for all students at Te Kauwhata Primary School'.

Overall, you can see there has been improvement in Reading and Writing when we compare the end of Term 4 data from 2024 to the data from Term 1 2025 (1.1% increase in Reading and 1.6% increase in Writing). There has been a slight decrease of 0.9% in Maths in comparison to the end of 2024.

We are happy with the results for Term 1 as we are assessing our students against our new refreshed English and Maths Curriculum. This is a mind shift for our team, but a necessary one as we are now assessing our students against their expected year level.

The previous curriculum had levels which covered two years (24 months) of learning as follows

- Level 1 Year 1 2
- Level 2 Year 3 4
- Level 3 Year 5 6

Now it is as simple as each school level, eg. Year 1, Year 2, has learning that our students need to learn in that year (12 months).

I do think that our Term 2 data will give us a clearer picture of how our students are tracking as we look to accelerate the learning of our students.

At school, when we talk about the acceleration of children's learning, we mean that children's

learning is happening at a rapid pace, and students are either catching up to where they are expected to be or they are making 1 - 2 years' progress inside a calendar year. This is our new strategic goal, and all our team will be focused on accelerating the learning of our students who need it for the rest of 2025.

While we acknowledge that some of the groups have slipped slightly since the end of 2024, be assured that our teachers are working hard to support all our students make progress against the refreshed curriculum.

Reporting to Parents Meeting:

At TKP, we are strong believers in the value of a strong home-school partnership. Parents and whaanau are our children's first teachers, and as a staff, we build upon the learning that takes place in the home.

So to support our ongoing home-school partnership, we will have two meetings this term to explain how we will be reporting against the Refreshed English and Maths Curriculum.

The two dates are the -

- 10th June at 7.45am
- 11th June at 5.30pm

We have decided to have one at 7.45am to cater for parents who work at night and one at 5.30pm to cater for parents who work during the day. I look forward to seeing you at one of these meetings!

We will also have two more meetings in Term 4 and we will keep you posted on these dates in Term 4.

Attendance Prize Winners Term 1



Here are the remaining term dates for 2025:

Term 2 - 29 April to 27 June (with a MOE-sanctioned Maths teacher-only day on the 28th of April

Term 3 - 14 July to 19 September (Maths PLD - 14th July, and TOD for Koroneihana on 5th September).

Term 4 - 6 October to 12 December.

In 2025, schools are legally required to be open for 193 days. Every year, the Board of Trustees works within the Ministry of Education's guidelines and decides when the school is open for instruction. Teacher-only days are not included in the 193 days, as on teacher-only days the school is closed for instruction.

Teacher Only Day - 14th July

Schools from across our region have booked in a Teacher Only Day for the 14th of July. This is the third day of four Maths Curriculum Days that we are required to have in regard to the refreshed Maths Curriculum. Our staff need to have these days close to one another so that they can meet the obligations of the new curriculum and what it means for the children in our school.

To support our staff and continue the momentum that they gained from the Maths PLD we have had, we are releasing our teachers to attend this PLD on the 14th of July.

The school will not be closed but our team will be providing learning to students so they can work at home. If you can keep your child at home to work online it will be greatly appreciated. We will have a skeleton staff on-site made up of support staff and relievers, to cater for students whose families need to send them to school.

We are asking for your support in this matter because if we close the school on the 14th of July, we will not meet our calendar obligations to the MOE, and we will have to extend our school year by one day, meaning we finish on Monday 15th of December. We hope that you understand and will support our request.

We will reschedule our poowhiri for Term 3 to the 15th of July. We will also book our fourth Maths Curriculum Day in 2026, to ensure there are no more disruptions to 2025.

Your help in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Reminders:

School Start time and Drop off

We would like to ask that you do not drop your children off before 8.15am as there will be no adult in their classroom or the playground to supervise them. This becomes a Health and Safety issue, both for children and the school. Teachers arrive between 8.00 am and 8.30 am and are expected to be in class by 8.30 am. We would ask that for the health and safety of your children being unsupervised, they do not arrive at school before 8.15am. We will get in contact with you if we see it happening.

Before-school care is available locally through KBEEZ Kids. Please ring Karen on 021 - 242 - 5524 if this is something that you need. There are information packs available at the office if you require further information.

Parking

A reminder that parking before and after school has to be in the designated parking areas along Mahi Rd and Wira St. As we work with the police to ensure we maintain safety for all our students and our school community, any car or vehicle parking on the yellow lines and across grass verges will result in your car number plate being alerted to them.

Internet Safety -

We have deployed a new filtering and monitoring system for our chromebooks to ensure your children are as safe as possible online. This system automatically detects any concerning behaviours, and alerts us so that we are able to deal with it as required. Below is a message your children will be receiving in their classrooms about it.

The school is using safeguarding and monitoring technology to help keep you safer online and ensure you use your device as best as possible to support your learning. If you use a school device at any time of day, the school and teachers can monitor your activity to support you better.

The school is responsible for its devices, networks and Google accounts, 24/7. If you use your school-issued Google account to sign into Chrome on a personal Chromebook at any time of the day, including at home, we will also be monitoring the activity within that Chrome session. Please be especially aware of this when you are not at school. Because it is a school Google account, we need to ensure it is used safely all the time, wherever and whenever it is being used. Know that this may include taking screenshots of personal Chromebooks if risky behaviour is detected when the school Google account is being used on it.

Importantly for BYOD, the technology being used will only monitor activity within the Chromebook session signed in with the school Google account. The technology cannot monitor activity beyond the school account's Chrome session. Therefore, if you are undertaking personal activities, do not use the school Google account to do so. Use a personal Google account to sign into the Chromebook. That account is your and/or your parents' responsibility to manage.
