We're so proud of the thoughtfulness and creativity Room 16 has shown, and we look forward to continuing this exciting learning journey together!









































Firewise

Last Friday, our Year 1 - 2 children had a visit from Firewise as part of their recent learning about fire safety. It was great to have our Te Kauwhata Community Firefighters - Corey, Ashley and Katie to reinforce the importance of being safe around fire, and what to do in an emergency.

Here is an important message from the team:

A huge thank you TKP for giving us the opportunity to work with the teachers and students with Firewise. It was a great success with many Firewise Champions within not only our school and home, but our community too.

This brings me to an important message. Do you have working smoke alarms in your whare?

The minimum requirement for smoke alarms in a residential home is at least one on every level of the house, and one within 3m of every bedroom door. Ideally, you should have one in every bedroom, lounge, living room, and hallway. If you don't, please make contact with the school, giving your details, including name, phone number and address. Our local Te Kauwhata Volunteer Fire Brigade will come and complete a Home Fire Safety Visit and install smoke alarms, free of charge. BE SAFE, STAY SAFE, BE FIREWISE! ~ Corey Rees

It was an auspicious occasion, and I would like to acknowledge Matua Vince Hapi for all his support in making sure we followed tikanga as we blessed this new learning space.

The name that has been gifted for this learning space is Turangawaewae, which ties in beautifully with our Ngaa Marmara o Ngaa Muka classrooms. Maahoe, Patatee, Hiinau.

The names Maahoe, Patatee and Hiinau are a part of a Tongikura from Kiingi Taawhiao.

Maaku anoo e hanga tooku nei whare Ko ngaa pou oo roto he maahoe, he patatee Ko te taahuhu, he hiinau Me whakatupu ki te hua o te rengarenga Me whakapakari ki te hua o te kawariki. I will build my own house
The pillars will be of māhoe and patatee
The ridgepole of hiinau
It will be nourished by the fruit of the rengarenga
Strengthened by the fruit of the kawariki

It is believed that when Te Puea had built the Tuurangawaewae marae, she also used these throughout the marae itself.

A big thank you to the team of whaanau who prepared our kai on Sunday, the 25th of May, to ensure that we all had enough to eat on Monday, and a huge thank you to Waikare Marae, Maurea Marae, and Nepe Whaanau for the use of their multi-kai cookers that cooked our food!

- One TKP Teacher Only Day for Koroneihana 5th of September



Teacher Only Day - 14th July

Schools from across our region have booked in a Teacher Only Day for the 14th of July. This is the third day of four Maths Curriculum Days that we are required to have in regard to the refreshed Maths Curriculum. Our staff need to have these days close to one another so that they can meet the obligations of the new curriculum and what it means for the children in our school.

To support our staff and continue the momentum that they gained from the Maths PLD we have had, we are releasing our teachers to attend this PLD on the 14th of July.

The school will not be closed but our team will be providing learning to students so they can work at home. If you can keep your child at home to work online it will be greatly appreciated.

We will have a skeleton staff on-site made up of support staff and relievers, to cater for students whose families need to send them to school.

We are asking for your support in this matter because if we close the school on the 14th of July, we will not meet our calendar obligations to the MOE, and we will have to extend our school year by one day, meaning we finish on Monday 15th of December. We hope that you understand and will support our request.

We will reschedule our poowhiri for Term 3 to the 15th of July. We will also book our fourth Maths Curriculum Day in 2026, to ensure there are no more disruptions to 2025.

Reminders

Parking

A reminder that parking before and after school has to be in the designated parking areas along Mahi Rd and Wira St. As we work with the police to ensure we maintain safety for all our students and our school community, any car or vehicle parking on the yellow lines and across grass verges will result in your car number plate being alerted to them.

Bus Changes

If your child normally catches the bus and on any given day your plans change, can you please contact the office to let the school know that your child isn't catching the bus that day.

ETAP Parent Portal:

Our ETAP Parent Portal is now up and running. If you haven't downloaded the Etap @School App already, you will have received an invite to your email with instructions on how to access it. We must have your updated phone numbers and email addresses so that you are able to access the information in the app. If your information needs updating, please contact the office.

We believe that communication is important in our current environment and the ETAP Parent Portal allows you to receive up-to-date information about your child, their class and other important school information.

School Start time and Drop off

We would like to ask that you do not drop your children off before 8.15am as there will be no adult in their classroom or the playground to supervise them. This becomes a Health and Safety issue, both for children and the school. Teachers arrive between 8.00 am and 8.30 am and are expected to be in class by 8.30 am. We would ask that for the health and safety of your children being unsupervised, they do not arrive at school before 8.15am. We will get in contact with you if we see it happening.

Before-school care is available locally through KBEEZ Kids. Please ring Karen on 021 - 242 - 5524 if this is something that you need. There are information packs available at the office if you require further information.

Internet Safety -

We have deployed a new filtering and monitoring system for our chromebooks to ensure your children are as safe as possible online. This system automatically detects any concerning behaviours, and alerts us so that we are able to deal with it as required. Below is a message your children will be receiving in their classrooms about it.

The school is using safeguarding and monitoring technology to help keep you safer online and ensure you use your device as best as possible to support your learning. If you use a school device at any time of day, the school and teachers can monitor your activity to support you better.

The school is responsible for its devices, networks and Google accounts, 24/7. If you use your school-issued Google account to sign into Chrome on a personal Chromebook at any time of the day, including at home, we will also be monitoring the activity within that Chrome session. Please be especially aware of this when you are not at school. Because it is a school Google account, we need to ensure it is used safely all the time, wherever and whenever it is being used. Know that this may include taking screenshots of personal Chromebooks if risky behaviour is detected when the school Google account is being used on it.

Importantly for BYOD, the technology being used will only monitor activity within the Chromebook session signed in with the school Google account. The technology cannot monitor activity beyond the school account's Chrome session. Therefore, if you are undertaking personal activities, do not use the school Google account to do so. Use a personal Google account to sign into the Chromebook. That account is your and/or your parents' responsibility to manage.
